



Visual Arts

- -The Main Gallery hosts 6 juried invitational shows and three educational shows per year, in addition to hosting the Fine Craft Collective every winter
- -The Up Gallery hosts a rotation of work based on availability
- -We provide work on display for a variety of locations around Northfield, including Allina Clinic, and soon City Hall
- -Our Guild Shop, featuring over 100 artists, shifts on a weekly bases with new work, undergoing significant updates seasonally, with a revenue of \$38,461

This past year, the Guild has welcomed 12 new class leader/facilitators into our Education programming! These vibrant teaching artists have, and/or will, be offering new and exciting classes to our line-up, with the potential to bring new audiences through our doors.

We have also welcomed back our "Creating Community Club" program, as well as a new music and art collaboration with EPIC Enterprises, both of which provide arts experiences for adults with disabilities in the Northfield community.

Our Young People's Theater Workshop had another successful summer, we were able to run two additional sessions of our Kids Spin Through the Arts FREE art experience program, and our ceramics programs have been running strong with new class opportunities being added!

Education & Engagement

The Guild was in attendance at many community events in the past year, including Pride in the Park, Riverfront Fine Arts Festival, Hispanic Heritage Celebration, and the inaugural International Day of Peace. These events introduce many new potential constituents to the Guild, and offer free artmaking to attendees!

We completed a very exciting Artist Development Workshop collaboration with three other regional art centers with the help of funding from SEMAC (Southeastern Minnesota Arts Council), and are enthusiastically planning this year's collaboration, which will increase our reach to 8 other centers, and feature 9 important topics that encourage artist learning and networking!

In the last year we were also back in the schools doing free afterschool art lessons with elementary youth, as well as entertaining a van load of middle schoolers here in our downtown building each week. This year we will be increasing our middle school attendance to a bus load (!), and have added the Northfield Montessori School to our weekly schedule of creative art opportunities!
